EU INTERREG IVA Supporting Local Enterprise

The EU's INTERREG IVA Programme (2007-2013), which is managed by the Special EU Programmes Body, has allocated approx mately €30 million worth of support to various programmes and initiatives designed to develop local enterprise. This assistance is provided on a cross-border basis and is being used to support the growth of a more entrepreneurial culture throughout the region.

One of the core objectives of the INTERREG IVA Programme is to develop the economy by encouraging innovation in enterprise and business development. Many hundreds of different businesses have been supported to date which will create a sustainable and lasting legacy for the European Union assistance that has been provided.

Key amongst this assistance has been the granting of £12 million for the North West Science Park, which will involve the construction of a 50,000 sq ft science park facility at Fort George and a 20,000 sq ft extension to the CoLab facility at the Letterkenny Institute of Technology. Other elements of support have focused on particular areas including incubator units for business start-ups and investments in specific sectors such as the creative industries and financial and customer services.
